Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God's wrath, for it is written, "It is mine to avenge; I will repay," says the Lord. *Romans 12:19*

Review

Joseph was his father's favorite son Joseph had the gift of dreams and dream interpretation Joseph used the gift immaturely and his brothers hated him for it Joseph was sold into slavery by his brothers Joseph ran into God in the dark moments of his life Joseph paid a high price for making a godly decision Joseph was in prison for more than a decade Joseph had his moment before Pharaoh and ended up in charge of everything Joseph is managing the economy of Egypt in preparation for a famine

Now Joseph was the governor of the land, the one who sold grain to all its people. So when Joseph's brothers arrived, they bowed down to him with their faces to the ground. As soon as Joseph saw his brothers, he recognized them, but he pretended to be a stranger and spoke harshly to them. "Where do you come from?" he asked.

"From the land of Canaan," they replied, "to buy food." Although Joseph recognized his brothers, they did not recognize him. – Genesis 42:6-8

Life Principle: The people who have hurt you the most may one day <u>need you</u>.

And [Joseph] wept so loudly that the Egyptians heard him, and Pharaoh's household heard about it. *– Genesis 45:2*

Life Principle: The pain of betrayal is real and must be dealt with in a way that acknowledges that God is <u>with you</u>.

Then Joseph said to his brothers, "Come close to me." When they had done so, he said, "I am your brother Joseph, the one you sold into Egypt! And now, do not be distressed and do not be angry with yourselves for selling me here, because it was to save lives that God sent me ahead of you. For two years now there has been famine in the land, and for the next five years there will not be plowing and reaping. But God sent me ahead of you to preserve for you a remnant on earth and to save your lives by a great deliverance. - Genesis 45:4-7

Life Principle: God's purpose is better seen with a wide-angle lens.

But Joseph said to them, "Don't be afraid. Am I in the place of God? You intended to harm me, but God intended it for good to accomplish what is now being done, the saving of many lives. - Genesis 50:19-20

Life Principle: None of the bad in your life can ever become good until you are first willing to acknowledge God's presence in the bad and then refuse to "play God" when things are good.

Life Principle: God forgave us when we did not deserve it. When we forgive, we are simply acting in a way that shows we are confident that God is with us.

How would my life be different if I was absolutely convinced in every moment, no matter how good or how bad, that God was with me?
