## The Joy and Pain of Coming Clean

<sup>5</sup>This is the message we have heard from him and declare to you: God is light; in him there is no darkness at all. <sup>6</sup> If we claim to have fellowship with him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. <sup>7</sup> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, his Son, purifies us from all sin.

<sup>8</sup> If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us.

— 1 John 1:5-8

#### **Biblical Truths**

- God wants us to step out of our <u>darkness</u> into his <u>light</u> (vs. 5)
- God doesn't do gray (vs. 6)
- God's purity has a ripple effect within his family (vs. 7)
- God wants us to tell the truth about <u>ourselves</u> (vs. 8)

One of the greatest inhibitors to spiritual growth is our denial of the true condition of our own souls.

#### **Confession includes:**

- 1. An acknowledgement of the wrong that was done
- 2. A pronouncement of personal ownership
- 3. A willingness to go public

Therefore, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. – James 5:16a

#### 1 John 1:9

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.
