A Tale of Two Confessions LUKE 18:9-13

To some who were confident of their own righteousness and looked down on everybody else, Jesus told this parable:

The Target: People who believe that they have arrived

Confession 1 LUKE 18:10-12

"Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee stood up and prayed about himself: 'God, I thank you that I am not like other men—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week and give a tenth of all I get."

The Pharisee: The sin of pride (1 Corinthians 10:12)

The compromise of comparison

The tragedy of spiritual trophies

The Confession: Ineffective and wasted

Confession 2 LUKE 18:13

But the tax collector stood at a distance. He would not even look up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

The Tax Collector: The beauty of <u>humility</u> (James 4:6 and 10)

The power of a 3-word confession...

Me, a sinner

The blessing of mercy

The Confession: Received and justified

The Truth of the Tale LUKE 18:14

"I tell you that this man, rather than the other, went home justified before God. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted."

Next Steps
