# A common approach to the hard teachings of Jesus:

That's not what He really meant!

## **Important Context**

Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem to die for the sins of mankind.

#### **Three Cringe Conversations** (Luke 9:57-62)

<sup>57</sup> As they were walking along the road, a man said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

 $^{58}\mbox{Jesus}$  replied, "Foxes have holes and birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man has no place to lay his head."

Underlying issue: It's easy to say "I will follow."

**Truth:** There is a cost to following Jesus.

Application: You must count the cost before you commit.

**Reward:** The reward for following Jesus is <u>eternal</u>.

<sup>59</sup> He said to another man, "Follow me."

But the man replied, "Lord, first let me go and bury my father."

 $^{\rm 60}\,\rm Jesus$  said to him, "Let the dead bury their own dead, but you go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

Underlying statement: I want to follow, but first...

**Truth:** You must be a follower of Jesus first and foremost. Every other role is subservient to following Jesus.

Application: We must allow Jesus to define our priorities.

 $^{\rm 61}\,\rm Still$  another said, "I will follow you, Lord; but first let me go back and say good-by to my family."

<sup>62</sup>Jesus replied, "No one who puts his hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God."

**Underlying excuse:** I will follow when the people in my life are are ok with it.

Truth: Our priorities must always be centered on the priorities of Jesus.

**Application:** We focus on having our earthly affairs in order. What about our eternal affairs?
