A Note from Grant Fishbook LEAD TEACHING PASTOR



In every wedding I officiate, there's a strategically planned moment when the tension in the room goes up dramatically. This moment occurs as

the bride and groom face each other and I say to the groom,

"I'm going to ask you a question. If you get the answer to the question wrong, I'm going to leave, and you will have to find someone else to do your wedding. And in case you're wondering, I am not kidding. I need to know your answer to this question. The bride's father needs to know your answer to this question, and most importantly, God needs to hear your answer to this question. No pressure. Here's my question. If it came down to a choice between your life and your bride's life, would you die for her?"

I've heard some amazing answers to that question over the years and in pretty much every case, when the groom whispers, "I would," the bride cries, her father cries, both moms cry, *I cry*, and it's beautiful.

A well-placed question can change the direction of a moment and a life.

Jesus was a master of asking strategic questions. His conversations were full of questions that made people stop, ponder, and respond. Sometimes his questions provoked anger and frustration. Sometimes his questions forced people to look deep within their own soul. This fall, we're going to hear the questions of Jesus, and then we'll stop, ponder, and respond. Because I believe the questions Jesus asked thousands of years ago are questions he's waiting for each of us to answer today.

Jesus asked...

- "Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to your life?"
- "Do you believe I am able to do this?"
- "Who do you say that I am?"
- "Why are you so afraid? Do you still have no faith?"
- "Why do you call me Lord, Lord, and do not do the things that I say?"
- "Are you going to leave me too?"

These are just a few of the questions we'll face together this fall at Christ the King Community Church. I can't wait to see what God does as we bravely respond together!

Where is God inviting you to grow?

Growing in our faith requires action, but how do we find that next step God is inviting us to take?

If you're feeling stagnant, stuck or even bored in your spiritual growth, the Spiritual Health Self-Assessment serves as a tool to help you identify where you are right now and discover the next good thing God is inviting you into. If you already know what God is asking you to do, just keep doing that! This tool was never meant to be another religious "todo" list. Rather than distract you from the Holy Spirit's whisper, our hope is that this series of introspective questions magnifies his leading and prompting.

Once you've finished the assessment, there are many next steps you can take—anywhere, at any time. You'll find those at **ctk.church/shsa/nextsteps**.

There are other next steps you can take with us right here at CTK. Here are some upcoming opportunities to help you move forward in a particular area of spiritual health:

To get started, talk to another trusted believer and see if they'd be willing to meet with you after you take the assessment. Then go to **grow.ctk.church** to take the assessment (about 15 minutes) and have it emailed to your discussion partner. If you are looking for someone to have this conversation with, you can also call the church and ask for a 30-minute next steps session with the pastor on call that week.

Do you know what's holding you back?

Self-assessment leads to new discoveries and tangible growth for a CTK attendee

The Spiritual Health Self-Assessment opened my eyes to all the different areas of my faith. It showed me where in my life I tend to run away or not pay attention as much.

One area the assessment measures is integration. I noticed that bottling up my feelings impacted my faith because I would just throw them at God one day and be angry at him, rather than walking with God and others as I go. Instead of confronting others, I would confront God. I was unaware that my feelings and relationships with others actually have a direct impact on how I understand God.

Having God reveal these areas to me helped me recenter and push myself to grow more in my faith! As a result, I have been communicating with others and opening up more. I'm being honest with my feelings rather than bottling them up and keeping things inside until I explode.

It makes me feel very vulnerable at times, but I know God is calling me to it and it is growing my trust in him as he guides me through moments of discomfort. I think if I were to take the assessment in a few months my answers would be different—because I know I am growing!



A passion for the imprisoned

CTK volunteer brings spiritual refreshment to men who are thirsty for the Living Water

Y NAME IS KARL NIELSEN, and I love to serve in the church and in the community. Over the last 10 years, Jesus opened surprising doors for me to use my gifts to connect with people and share my faith. I have served here in CTK with baptisms and led a Men's Biblical Deep Dive group. I try to jump at pretty much any opportunity to serve. But there have been some big obstacles to my biggest passion.

In the beginning of COVID I needed to move for my job. Once arriving in Tehachapi, CA, I lived 4500 feet up a mountain above a supermax prison. This is where the Holy Spirit talked to me and ministered to me. The calling I felt was to serve those in prison who need Jesus in their lives. I patiently waited for the time I could serve. But while waiting I was transferred back to Washington. That was quite a curve ball. Why didn't God have me serving in the prison literally below my feet in California?

I looked into jail ministry here in Whatcom County. Scared at first, I made my way into the jail for the first time with a chaplain coworker. What I found there were men who were thirsty for the living water. I have been going to the jail every Thursday night with great excitement to hold a Bible study with these men—men whom I call gentlemen.

Serving in this capacity has brought me closer with the Lord and has renewed my faith in the direction of serving those who turn toward Jesus and ask to be forgiven and redeemed. We have a faithful group of gentlemen who come every Thursday night and ask for prayer for multitudes of reasons. They also invite the Holy Spirit into their hearts. We bring study notes and Bibles to the men, and we pray for them during the week. We let them know that they are on our minds and hearts.

The greatest gift of serving in this way is to have a front row seat to watch

God work in the hearts of his children. To see the physical transformation of some of the men has been breathtaking. A sense of calm and peace washes over them. You see weight gain in healthy ways. Their whole presence becomes more inviting.

But as COVID cases have increased, we've been unable to serve in-person at the jail. That's another huge challenge. So we pray for those in jail, their families, and the crime victims. It is not just the inmates who are ministered to. It's also me and my ministry partner. As we get to know and talk with these men, we're reminded of a valuable lesson—"it's OK to not be OK".


Jesus has blessed me with this ministry. I love to reach out to those who are unchurched and bring God's word to them. Despite the challenges, I love prison ministry. It fulfills my calling to love God and love others. The journey has definitely not been easy, but it has been so good.
