Pick a person... Ecclesiastes 4

Again I looked and saw all the oppression that was taking place under the sun:

I saw the tears of the oppressed—

and they have no comforter;

power was on the side of their oppressors—

and they have no comforter.

² And I declared that the dead,

who had already died, are happier than the living,

who are still alive.

³ But better than both

is the one who has never been born,

who has not seen the evil

that is done under the sun.

⁴ And I saw that all toil and all achievement spring from one person's envy of another. This too is meaningless, a chasing after the wind.

⁵ Fools fold their hands

and ruin themselves.

⁶ Better one handful with tranquility than two handfuls with toil and chasing after the wind.

Person #1: Disillusioned and devastated

⁷ Again I saw something meaningless under the sun:

8 There was a man all alone:

he had neither son nor brother.

There was no end to his toil,

yet his eyes were not content with his wealth.

"For whom am I toiling," he asked.

"and why am I depriving myself of enjoyment?"

This too is meaningless—

a miserable business!

Person #2: Successful ...but alone (Proverbs 15:17)

...but dissatisfied

¹³ Better a poor but wise youth than an old but foolish king who no longer knows how to heed a warning. ¹⁴ The youth may have come from prison to the kingship, or he may have been born in poverty within his kingdom. ¹⁵ I saw that all who lived and walked under the sun followed the youth, the king's successor. ¹⁶ There was no end to all the people who were before them. But those who came later were not pleased with the successor. This too is meaningless, a chasing after the wind.

Person #4: Popular but guickly forgotten

Connected but only on the surface

⁹Two are better than one, because they have a good return for their labor:

¹⁰ If either of them falls down, one can help the other up.

But pity anyone who falls

and has no one to help them up.

¹¹ Also, if two lie down together, they will keep warm. But how can one keep warm alone?

¹² Though one may be overpowered, two can defend themselves.

A cord of three strands is not quickly broken.

Person #3: Connected ...and not alone

...and productive

...and known

...and protected
