Discipleship or the road to spiritual maturity is a process.

The Five Stage of Spiritual Growth

- Spiritually <u>Dead</u> (Ephesians 2:1-2, 4-5)
 - o Characteristics: unbelief, brokenness, seeking Need: loving relationships with followers of Jesus, to see the Gospel lived out, an explanation of the Gospel, an invitation to follow Jesus.
- Spiritual Infant (1 Peter 2:2-3)
 - Characteristics: unaware, discovery, dependent
 - Need: the personal attention of a disciple-maker, care & protection, teaching & modeling the new truths of the faith, developing new habits
- Spiritual Child
 - Characteristics: teachable, inquisitive, self-centered Need: a strong relational connection to a mature believer
- Spiritual Young Adult
 - o Characteristics: other-focused, responsible, Godcentered.
 - Needs: trained & empowered to serve with their Godgiven gifts & abilities
- Spiritual Parent
 - o Characteristics: reproducing, the ability to make disciples
 - Need: regular encouragement & accountability
