- An invitation Jesus makes to ordinary people.
- An invitation to become an <u>apprentice</u> in the way of Christ.
 The student is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like their teacher.
 Luke 6:40
- An invitation that will cost you.
- An invitation to become a <u>disciple</u>-maker.
- An invitation to experience <u>life in Jesus</u> every single day.
 The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.
 John 10:10
