Naturalists - Loving God out of doors (Psalm 19)

<u>Sensates</u> - Loving God with the senses (Psalm 34:8 and 1 Kings 19)

Traditionalists - Loving God through ritual and symbol (1 Corinthians 11)

Ascetics - Loving God in solitude and simplicity (Psalm 46:10)

Activists - Loving God through confrontation (Psalm 68)

<u>Caregivers</u> - Loving God by loving others (Mark 10:45)

Enthusiasts - Loving God with mystery and celebration (Psalm 98:4)

Contemplatives - Loving God through adoration (Psalm 63)

Intellectuals - Loving God with the mind (Proverbs 1:5-7)
