

Chapter 1: God Created

The creation story revealed four important words:

Spirit, Light, Good and Life (all descriptors of God in the New Testament)

Humankind is not the point of Creation

God is the pinnacle of Creation

Chapters 2-3: Creation of People and the Fall of Man

God Creates Eve—first wedding (interesting dress code)

Satan is introduced

With sin, there is always a price to pay

Chapter 4: An Expanding Family — Cain and Abel

Cain's great difficulty is that he could not master his sin

Chapter 5: Genealogy: God Limits Human Lifespan

Chapters 6-8: Noah and the Ark

Flood, boat, and animal story that wrestles with obedience, grace, justice and love

Chapter 9: Drunk Noah

Timeless truth: alcohol can really mess up your life

Sin didn't drown in the flood

Chapter 10: More Genealogy

Chapter 11: The Tower of Babel

A story about independence from God

The Lesson: Life with God is simply the best way to live

Chapter 12-16 Begins the Story of Abraham, The Father of Our Faith

Huge Promise: Through him would come a nation that would bless the nations

In faith, Abraham actively pursued God

"Do not be afraid" — fear inhibits faith

When God creates plan A, do not create Plan B

The <u>waiting</u> time is never <u>wasting</u> time in God's plan
