Jesus released his life

What did God release?

His son.

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. – *John 3:16*

Why did He release His son?

To save the world.

For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him. – *John 3:17*

Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins. – *Hebrews 9:22*

What does this mean for us?

Whoever receives and believes can become a child of God.

Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God – children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God. – *John 1:12-13*

There's a right way to receive this gift:

1. With repentance

2. With gratitude

3. With belief

For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Peter, and then to many... – 1 Cor.15:3

4. In wholeness

5. In obedience

Jesus replied "If anyone loves me he will obey my teaching. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him." – John 14:23

I welcome the Holy Spirit to come live in me, to transform my thoughts and actions, and empower me to live a life that pleases God. I accept God's gift of eternal life. Thank you, Father, for loving me enough to save me. Amen.
