### Proverbs 22:17-21

<sup>17</sup> Pay attention and turn your ear to the sayings of the wise; apply your heart to what I teach,

<sup>18</sup> for it is pleasing when you keep them in your heart and have all of them ready on your lips.

- <sup>19</sup> So that your trust may be in the Lord, I teach you today, even you.
- <sup>20</sup> Have I not written thirty sayings for you, sayings of counsel and knowledge,

<sup>21</sup> teaching you to be honest and to speak the truth, so that you bring back truthful reports to those you serve?

## Wisdom has the ability to transform us if we are willing to apply it. (vs. 17)

<u>Transform</u>	The proverbs of Solomon son of David, king of Israel:
	<sup>2</sup> for gaining wisdom and instruction:

for understanding words of insight;

- <sup>3</sup> for receiving instruction in prudent behavior, doing what is right and just and fair;
- <sup>4</sup> for giving prudence to those who are simple, knowledge and discretion to the young—
- <sup>5</sup> let the wise listen and add to their learning, and let the discerning get guidance—
- <sup>6</sup> for understanding proverbs and parables, the sayings and riddles of the wise.

<sup>7</sup>The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction. – Proverbs 1:1-7

# Wisdom is embodied in the <u>heart</u> and spoken thoughtfully with the <u>mouth</u>. (vs. 18)

TongueHe who loves a pure heart and whose speech is gracious<br/>will have the king for his friend. - Proverbs 22:11

When words are many, sin is not absent, but he who holds his tongue is wise. - Proverbs 10:19

## *In every word (spoken or typed) have you considered the <u>truth,</u> <i>the timing, the tone, and the temperature of your heart?*

TemperDo not make friends with a hot-tempered man,<br/>do not associate with one easily angered,<br/>or you may learn his ways<br/>and get yourself ensnared. - Proverbs 22:24-25

#### Wisdom knows that only God can be fully trusted. (vs. 19)

TrustTrust in the Lord with all your heart<br/>and lean not on your own understanding;<br/>in all your ways submit to him,<br/>and he will make your paths straight. - Proverbs 3:5-6

#### Wisdom always reflects truth and honesty (vs. 21)

TruthAn honest witness tells the truth,<br/>but a false witness tells lies.The words of the reckless pierce like swords,<br/>but the tongue of the wise brings healing.Truthful lips endure forever,<br/>but a lying tongue lasts only a moment.Deceit is in the hearts of those who plot evil,<br/>but those who promote peace have joy. - Proverbs 12:17-20

#### Next Step:

- Keep going (or get started) on the Proverbs Challenge: read the chapter of Proverbs that corresponds to the day of the month. (May 22 = Proverbs 22)
- In your interactions over the coming week, keep the "T" words in mind (truth, timing, tone, temper). When you discover a difficult area, ask God for the wisdom, will, and power to make a change.

#### **Small Group Questions**

- 1) When it comes to wisdom, who has had the greatest influence on your life? Share a piece of wisdom they gave you that you still use today.
- 2) Think back over your verbal interactions of the past week. Are there any you regret? Why? Any you'd like to change? Why?
- 3) Where do you put your trust? (The easy answer is God.) Where else do you put your trust? Is that eroding your trust in God?
- 4) Are there any areas of life where you feel it's OK to not speak the truth? Can you find some other proverbs about honestly and truthfulness?
- 5) Is there a proverb you've read during the Proverbs Challenge that is transforming or bringing increased confidence into your life? What is it?
- 6) What do you need prayer for today?
