Wisdom = God's principles applied

The wicked flee though no one pursues, but the righteous are as bold as a lion. – Proverbs 28:1

Paranoid vs. Poised

Whoever conceals their sins does not prosper, but the one who confesses and renounces them finds mercy. – Proverbs 28:13

Conceal vs. Confess

Whoever remains stiff-necked after many rebukes will suddenly be destroyed—without remedy. - Proverbs 29:1

Resistance vs. Receptivity

Evildoers are snared by their own sin, but the a righteous one can sing and be glad. - Proverbs 29:6

Snared vs. Singing

Fools give full vent to their rage, but the wise bring calm in the end. – Proverbs 29:11

Chaos vs. Calm

Fear of man will prove to be a snare, but whoever trusts in the Lord is kept safe. - Proverbs 29:25

Fear of man vs. Fear of God

Discipline your children, and they will give you peace; they will bring you the delights you desire. - Proverbs 29:17
