Small things, done over a long period of time, create the greatest impact.

In Matthew 13, Jesus compared his huge kingdom to small things:

- A mustard seed (vs. 31)
- Yeast (vs. 33)
- A pearl (vs. 45)

God's Big Story Hinges on Small Things

But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are, so that no human being might boast in the presence of God. – 1 Corinthians 1:27-29

Matthew 13:44

"The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field, which a man found and covered up. Then in his joy he goes and sells all he has and buys that field."

What's in the hidden treasure box?

Big promises for weak, broken, lost people.

- 1) God's covenant with Abraham promises a <u>place</u> and <u>population</u> of the kingdom (*Genesis 17:6, 16*)
- 2) God's covenant with Moses establishes a <u>law</u> for the kingdom citizens (*Exodus 19:6*)
- 3) God's covenant with David enthrones an <u>eternal ruler</u> of the kingdom (2 Samuel 7:12-16)
- 4) Jesus' new covenant celebrates today's <u>present kingdom</u> and anticipates the <u>future</u> fulfillment of that kingdom (*Luke 22:14-20*)

Summary of the Big Story of the Bible

"The kingdoms of this world have become the kingdom of his Lord, and of His Christ, and he shall reign forever." — Revelation 11:15

What do you receive when you "sell all" to acquire that small treasure?

Everything.

"And the kingdom and the dominion and the greatness of the kingdoms under the whole heaven shall be given to the people of the saints of the Most High; his kingdom shall be an everlasting kingdom, and all dominions shall serve and obey him." - Daniel 7:27
