### Small Group Conversation Guide

# Desperate for Meaning / Ecclesiastes 1

Warm-up: Share about a time where you were disappointed by something or someone. Maybe it was something you put time, energy and money into that didn't pan out. Maybe it was a favorite team or influential person. How did that disappointment change your perspective on that something or someone?

### Read: Ecclesiastes 1:1-14

The author of Ecclesiastes (probably Solomon) says that all life is vanity, or striving after the wind. He uses the Hebrew word *hebel*, with means breath, vapor or smoke. Life is something that appears for awhile and then disappears.

- 1. Why do you think Solomon compares our life to a breath or vapor?
- 2. If we understand our life as a breath or vapor, how might that affect the way we view our time?
- 3. What are some of the examples he gives for the vanity of life? Which ones resonate with you? Why?
- 4. Solomon says, "all things are full of weariness" (verse 8). How have you felt weariness in your own life?
- 5. How does Jesus offer us a way out of being stuck in the vain cycle of life? How has Jesus given your life meaning?

#### Read Psalm 62:5-9

- 6. What things does the author (David) say only God can provide?
- 7. Verse 9 affirms the idea that we are just a breath or vapor, but adds that people of high estate are a delusion. What do you think he means?
- 8. If God is our only source of meaning, how does that affect the way we live our daily lives?
