The Selfishness Trap / Ecclesiastes 4

Warm-up: Can you recall a 'selfless act' someone did for you? What was it?

Read: Ecclesiastes 4:1-16

In this passage, Solomon looks at different traps of self-worship. We see that our world pushed towards pursuing *power*, *superiority*, *comfort* and *success*. All of these, Solomon says, are vanity (hevel) and chasing after the wind. They get us nowhere - they actually lead us into emptiness and loneliness.
