	Ecclesiastes 5

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Small Group Conversation Guide

The Weight of God / Ecclesiastes 5

Warm-up: Can you remember a moment that left you speechless? What happened and why do you think you were lost for words?

Read: Ecclesiastes 5:1-20

In this passage, Solomon first calls us to approach God in light of His position in heaven. He tells us to come to listen rather than to speak. In contrast to this, he then shows us the foolishness of giving money more weight in our lives than God - making that the focus of our hearts instead of the greatness of an eternal God.

- 1. Solomon says in verse 1 to draw near to listen to God rather than speak quickly and rashly. Do you find it challenging to listen to God? Why or why not?
- 2. Solomon contrasts listening with offering 'the sacrifice of fools'. What do you think he means?
- 3. Solomon says with a lot of dreams and words there is vanity. What do you think he means?
- 4. Follow up question to 3: Why is it more important to draw near and listen to God rather than just try to figure things out on our own?
- 5. Solomon contrasts giving weight to God with giving weight to money. In verse 10, he says someone who loves money will never be satisfied with money. Why is this?
- 6. Verse 13 says riches were kept their owner to his hurt. How can making money our focus in life hurt us? Are there ways you feel like you struggle with this?
- 7. Read verse 20. This verse implies that when God is our focus, he fills our life with joy. How can God be our joy, whatever circumstances we face?
- 8. Does this passage comfort or challenge you? Why?

Prayer: How can we pray for each other this week?

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
