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Small Group Conversation Guide

Desire and Discontentment / Ecclesiastes 6

Warm-up: Name three things on you want to do in your lifetime, i.e your 'bucket list'. Why did you pick those three?

Read: Ecclesiastes 6:1-12

In this passage, Solomon shows us that even if we get everything we want on earth, we will still be discontent.

- 1. What are the reasons Solomon lists for the vanity of pursuing wealth in verses 1-6?
- 2. Verse 2 says 'to some God gives wealth, possessions, and honor' but unfortunately they can't enjoy them. What is the potential danger of having material wealth and how can a Jesus follower best steward what God has given them?
- 3. In verse 9, Solomon talks about our 'wandering appetites' how our human desires are always changing. How does this create discontentment in our lives?
- 4. How do we combat being ruled by our wandering desires?
- 5. Solomon says 'the more words, the more vanity' in verse 11. How does this reinforce the wisdom in chapter 5:1-7?

Read Ephesians 4:17-24

- 6. How this chapter illustrate our struggle with human desires?
- 7. What does it look like to put on our 'new self' in Christ?
- 8. What is the benefit of the 'new self' and its desires compared to the 'old self'?

Prayer: How can we pray for each other this week?

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
