Summary From Last Week

Bad news: Jesus predicted deception, disaster, death and denial

Good news: Jesus promised the distribution of his word and the deliverance of his church

Eschatology

- From the Greek word *eschatos*, which means "last." Eschatology is the study of the last days.
- The study of events that will happen involving Christ's return is called **general eschatology**
- The study of events that will happen to an individual is called **personal eschatology**

Key Thought

We hold securely to what was promised while we wait for what was predicted.

We should focus on what we know, or are to know, over what we cannot know for sure.

Jesus asks us to keep watch. (Matthew 24:42, 25:13)

We are to be ready, to be wise, and to be faithful.

God has given each of us:

<u>Responsibilities</u> to take care of. (Matthew 24:45-51)

A relationship to prioritize. (Matthew 25:1-13)

Resources to invest. (Matthew 25:14-28)

Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell. – Matthew 10:28

Now this is eternal life: that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom you have sent. – John 17:3
